Extracting content from hard copy and handwritten manuscripts

Extracting content from hard copy manuscripts

Some publications are derived in part, if not entirely, from older hard copy material, such as machine typed papers or photocopies. Providing the text is clear enough to read **THEPUBLISHING.CO.UK** will be able to extract content and apply it to typeset pages by scanning and a minimum of editing. This service is, of course, an extra cost but the proficiency of our process generally makes this a realistic option for authors who can't do it for themselves for whatever reason. Before entering into any contract for this work, authors should send a few page samples, along with some indication of the overall extent of the work, all of which will be used for analysis and the provision of a quotation.

Extracting content from handwritten manuscripts

As in the case of the above some publications require the integration in part, or whole, of handwritten content, perhaps from a diary or series of journals. Based on experience in this field **THEPUBLISHING.CO.UK** is often able to extract the text with limited post-editing and that, along with supportive scans of illustrative material makes publishing of this type of content a viable option. This option has been appreciated by those self-publishers who have used the service.
